Although the end of a year is a time of remembrance, we are also thinking about 2019. We need your help as we move forward, and we will be asking you



### Beach Safety Update by Mike Kelly, CCL VP

#### **Croatan Beach Restoration Project**

On Thursday, November 28<sup>th</sup>, the VB Department of Public Works held a Pre-Bidders Conference. There were five companies that attended. If you are not familiar, this is a presentation by the contracts office addressing the specifics of the work request and an opportunity for anyone interested in bidding to ask questions. The two key dates are that the bids must be in not later than December 11<sup>th</sup>, and that the work must be done by May 27<sup>th</sup>, 2019, Memorial Day.

Part of the contract is for dune planting and fencing. We have no details yet of how that will be done and what, if anything, property owners need to do in preparation.

As previously stated, this will be a truck haul through the streets of Croatan. One bidder estimated that it would be about 3000 truckloads. There will be a presentation by Public Works to the Croatan community before that work begins. It is expected that will occur by the end of January.

#### 2018 Dune Restoration

The report received from Public Works said the following:

- 1. Purpose of the work was to restore the dune crest elevation to +19.0 ft NAVD88\* (the elevation above the 1% chance annual storm) in areas where the existing dune crest elevation was below this elevation.
- 2. The limits of the project were, along the dune line, between 502 S. Atlantic to 900 S. Atlantic.
- 3. The project began on 10/20/2018 and was completed on 11/14/2018.
- 4. Total dune restoration sand volume placed from the sand trap for this effort = 12,300 cubic yards.
- Dune face locations that did not receive sand were because the existing dune crest elevation was greater than +19.0 ft NAVD88 along with the dune face being well vegetated.


For the year, the total amount of sand used for the dune repair work = 19,200 cubic yards.

As you know, the City is now authorized to take up to 20,000 cubic yards per calendar year, so the amount resets on January 1, 2019. The intent is to use that for maintenance and repair through the course of the year, each year, once the main restoration project is complete.

\*The North American Vertical Datum of 1988 (NAVD 88) is the vertical control datum of orthometric height established for vertical control surveying in the United States of America based upon the General Adjustment of the North American Datum of 1988.

You may have read that Virginia Beach is among the safest cities in the nation. Certainly, it has been cited as THE SAFEST for cities of its size. That being said, the Virginia Beach Police Department (VBPD) – like many government entities is understaffed and overworked.

Recent incidents of vandalism, burglary, and theft in our neighborhood have raised concerns since we live a relatively incident-free enclave. The VBPD has published a booklet on home security.
