

Beach Safety Update for September 2019

Hurricane Dorian

These pictures show the Croatan beach at low tide the day after Dorian passed by us to the East.



The first shows the sea grass planted earlier in the year. Even though waves did hit the dunes, they stayed intact. The second photo shows that the berm build-up over the Summer has deteriorated from Dorian's wind and waves. You can see that it is still there, albeit worn. It did its job of protecting the dunes.

Safety, Security Update, Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), and Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO)

Safety: The summer is over and school has begun. Please mind our community 25 MPH speed limit and stop signs. As leaves fall and become wet with morning dew (or rainfall), they become slick as ice and can lead to loss of control even at slow speeds. Please drive carefully.



Croatan really dodged a bullet with Hurricane Dorian veering off to the northeast after hitting the Outer Banks. But, as the storm season deepens, expect more, and stronger rip currents. If you venture into the ocean while the water temperature is still pleasant and find yourself being dragged out to sea on a rip current, remember **do not swim against the current**. Rather, **swim parallel to the shore until you are out of the current**, then make your way back to shore. The lifeguards are gone for the season, so swim with a friend. The storms also alter the sea floor dramatically – **do not dive into the ocean** from a surfboard or paddleboard.

September is National Preparedness Month

I think it is safe to say that most of us have an emergency supply kit; but just in case there are those who don't – here are the basis that you should prepare in the event of approaching severe weather:

- · 3-day supply of non-perishable food that can be eaten out of the can/box;
- · 3-day supply of water (1 gallon/day for each member of the household);
- a hand-crank or battery-powered radio with weather band channel;
- extra batteries;
- portable charger for mobile phone(s);
- a written family emergency plan;
- multiple flashlights with extra batteries;
- · candles and waterproof matches (or a butane lighter)
- · first-aid-kit
- manual can opener (yes, they still exist)
- 3-day supply of prescription medicines (Hint: wait until storm warnings are issued before putting meds together so that the medications do not expire while sitting in the emergency kit)
- Food and water for pets
- Extra pair of eyeglasses
- · Plastic bags for trash
- · Any extra consumables for babies or elder family members
- · Cash (in case ATM and credit card processing machines are not operating)

- Full tank of gasoline for each vehicle (fill up ahead of the storm)
- Waterproof containers in which to store these items.

Know your evacuation zone (https://www.vaemergency.gov/hurricane-evacuation-zone-lookup/) and have two prospective destinations in mind. Please heed evacuation directions - I think we all saw the video of the woman on Ocracoke Island who didn't abide with the Dorian mandatory evacuation order and ended up in her attic to escape flood waters.

Security: The CCL is still seeking a few extra contributions to support the planned hours for our security patrol through the end of the year. As the "package delivery season" gets into full swing, this off-duty police officer's presence helps deter porch pirates. If you wish to contribute to the Security Fund, please contact any CCL Director.

On the subject of package delivery, exercise common sense precautions, such as not scheduling (or delaying delivery) during periods of planned absences or having packages delivered to a neighbor, who may be at home during the day.

Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC):

This month's CAC meeting has been postponed until September 18 – 7:00 PM at VBPD Second Precinct Headquarters, 820 Virginia Beach Blvd (aka: 17th Street). All are welcome to attend.

Diane D'Alberto is stepping down from the President's chair after several years at the helm, but will still manage the Adopt-a-Muster efforts.

Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO):

Brad Sike has stepped down as President of VBCCO. C. Douglas, Jr. ("Doug") has assumed the role.

Brian Solis, the Acting City Manager, attended the September meeting. I found him friendly, candid, and willing to share successes and challenges with the various civic association representatives present. He discussed the legal and business

challenges of regulating motorized scooters, the results of the recently completed city-wide survey, and provided a copy of proposed city code changes to be discussed at the September 24 City Council Meeting.

Virginia Beach Curbside Services: Trash Collection, Bulky Item Collection, Recycling and Yard Debris

Since we have more waste products after Dorian, you may want to review some of the city rules for waste collection. You can find the full information on the City website at https://www.vbgov.com/government/departments/public-works/pw-waste-management/Pages/curbside-services.aspx.

Some pointers on each service:

Trash Collection

- Have containers and/or items for pickup at the street between 5:00 p.m. the day prior to your day of collection and 7:00 a.m. the day of collection. In Croatan, Tuesday is the day of collection.
- Keep at least 3 feet of clearance between your container and any other item (yard waste bags, limbs, bulky items, mailboxes, cable boxes, or vehicles) including the blue recycle container.

Bulky Item Collection

• Use the Bulky Item Request Form found at the website above. Please note: The city has reached capacity to schedule for 9/17. They will schedule for 9/24 instead.

Recycling

- Paper: office paper, newspaper, junk mail, magazines, phone books, paper bags
- Cardboard & Chipboard: flattened, un-waxed, clean & dry
- Plastics Bottles # 1 -7, NO plastic bags.
- Cartons, including food and beverage cartons (juice, milk, soy milk, soup, broth, etc.)
- Glass Bottles & Jars: clear, green & brown; remove & discard lids.
- Metals: aluminum, steel, or tin food & beverage cans; clean aluminum foil

Yard Debris Collection

- Limbs up to 4 feet long and 6 inches in diameter will be collected in a pile not to exceed 4 x 4 x 4 feet.
- Two piles, generated from each house, will be collected on each collection day.
- You may also dispose of smaller yard debris, such as grass and leaves (no dirt, rocks, mulch or root balls) in up to 25 clear plastic bags, not more than 25 lbs. per bag.
- Tree removal debris is not collected at the curbside. However, it can be collected through the yard debris container program, provided each piece is no larger than 6 inches in diameter.
