Safety/Security:

From a safety standpoint, there are many pedestrians, dog walkers, and bicyclists out in the neighborhood, as well as children playing in streets (we did it when we were young, too). Please drive responsibly.



Many of us are also taking advantage of the enforced stay-at-home time to get renovations and yard work performed. Please ensure that your contractors do not unnecessarily block sidewalks, driveways, or roads (to include the impairment of sight-distances on curves and near intersections). Also, ask them to be mindful of access for postal delivery and trash collection.

Bear in mind, and please remind visitors, that **the beach is closed** by Executive Order of the Governor and agreement by Mayor Dyer and City Council, for all activity other than fishing and exercise (e.g., walking, running, surfing, yoga). Sunbathing and lounging at the beach during the COVID-19 stay-at-home mandate can incur a misdemeanor citation and fine. Any reopening schedule will be announced by City Council on the Coronavirus link above and promulgated on our website and Nextdoor.

I was informed by Parking Enforcement that (at least through May), the Croatan parking lot will remain free. It will still close at 5:30 PM. Both will be revisited later this month as decisionmakers review COVID-19 impact and risks in Virginia Beach.

Citizen's Action Committee (CAC):

There was no CAC meeting in April (nor will there be one in May). I did speak with Captain Wichtendahl of the Second Precinct who has agreed to increase patrols through Croatan during the wee-morning hours when some recent reports of vandalism are believed to have taken place.



Trash and Curbside Recycling

Garbage and Household Waste Collection

Please do not put the following items in your black cart:

Remodeling and building materials, carpet, doors, cabinets, toilets, sinks, rocks, dirt, concrete, vehicle parts, tires, paint cans, glass, propane tanks, hazardous materials

Please do not dispose of dirt or concrete in your black trash can. They weigh the can down, which increase collection and disposal costs. If you don't have a place to use these in your yard, they can be taken to the Virginia Beach Landfill and Resource Recovery Center, where dirt will be used for daily cover and concrete will be crushed into stone for roadbeds, thus reducing operating costs.

Acceptable Recyclable Material

Recycling Guide

- Paper: office paper, newspaper, junk mail, magazines, phone books, paper bags
- Cardboard & Chipboard: flattened, un-waxed, clean & dry
- Plastics Bottles # 1 -7, NO plastic bags.
- Cartons, including food and beverage cartons (juice, milk, soy milk, soup, broth, etc.)
- Glass Bottles & Jars: clear, green & brown; remove & discard lids.
- Metals: aluminum, steel, or tin food & beverage cans; clean aluminum foil

DO NOT PLACE RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS.

Pour out contents or wipe out cans and bottles. Place recyclables loosely directly in your container.

Townhome residents with the 18-gallon recycling bin container service may place any additional recyclables in paper bags next to their container.

Please do not put the following items in your blue cart:

Household garbage, waxed cardboard, yard waste (grass, leaves or branches), plastic bags - (plastic bags are collected at most grocery stores for recycling.), plastic toys, plastic pools, plastic motor oil containers, ceramic or ovenware dishes, Styrofoam, packing peanuts
