

President's Letter by Mike Kelly

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The hottest topic for the last several days has been Short-Term Rentals (STR). In July, there was a single bullet from a city presentation that spoke to an Overlay District in Croatan that would cover all properties on S. Atlantic and Vanderbilt Avenues. There would be no STRs outside of that area except those that are already in-place. Within the overlay area, any property could be an STR without going through the Conditional Use Process (CUP). Additionally, at the last City Council meeting, the Council lawyer stated that the council could approve this without agreement from the Croatan property owners. As you would expect, many residents reacted strongly to this information.

Our Vice-President, "Connie" Agresti is working this hard. He has communicated with city council members and the planning commission. The responses that he has received are reassuring and there appears to be no immediate effort to create a Croatan Overlay District. That said, the Board is aggressively monitoring. We will keep you informed.

Covid-19 has had a significant impact on all of us, especially our opportunities to socialize. The Social Committee has done a great job over the Summer putting together smaller events, especially with the weekly food trucks. Since the Governor just changed the rules, we can have a social event for the members of the Civic League. The committee is looking at an outdoor event in October. Please be on the lookout for more details. Also, if you have some ideas that you think would work, please pass them on to Amanda Robinson.

In addition to the national elections this Fall, we also have elections for the Board of Directors. Seven Board seats are on the docket. If you have an interest in joining the Board,

MPO Don Noha sent the following to CCL President Mike Kelly and myself. "*I* wanted to take a minute and express to you, and all of the residents in Croatan who have voiced their support of police, a sincere and heartfelt "thank you." In this time of strong anti-police sentiment being portrayed by the media and misguided efforts to defund the police, I have found that residents of Croatan remain supporters of law and order. I have worked part time as security in Croatan since 1998 and have gone out of their way to express their appreciation for the police presence in Croatan. The officers of the Virginia Beach Police Department have been fortunate to enjoy the support of its citizens, [partially due to the presence of the military in our area], without some of the challenges other areas of the continued protests that began in May 2020, VBPD officers have been subjected to long hours and cancelled days off in a contentious environment.

"Since the beginning of my part time employment in Croatan, I have been adamant that I want the residents to feel like they are receiving value for their donated dollar. I strive to be fair, firm and consistent with enforcement throughout the neighborhood. I quite frequently go above and beyond "routine" to address issues in the neighborhood. Although the police cannot be everywhere all the time, I am of the opinion that the police presence in Croatan makes a difference. Croatan has been fortunate to successfully establish itself as a secure neighborhood with a low crime rate due to the diligence of its residents in cooperating with the police. I look forward to that cooperative effort continuing. Thank you. – Don"

National Night Out: The nation's 37th National Night Out will be held on **October 6, 2020**. This event is intended to unite neighbors with police to make communities safer. National Night Out is held annually to:

• Heighten crime and drug prevention awareness;



- Generate support and participation in local anti-crime efforts;
- · Strengthen neighborhood spirit and police community relations; and
- Send a message to criminals letting them know local communities are organized and are fighting back.

Croatan has not had an organized National Night Out event for some years, but if people would like to conduct a flashlight walk around the block or through the neighborhood at 8:00 PM, they are encouraged to do so. The CCL will let the VBPD know that we are conducting this event.

Dogs on Beach: With the passage of Labor Day, we are again free to bring our fourlegged friends to the beach all hours of the day. If dogs are loose, they must be under verbal control of the handler – who is also responsible for picking up after the pooch.

Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC):

CAC meetings are again suspended due to re-imposed coronavirus mandates restricting gatherings. The following are provided for your information.



Vehicle Thefts: Late July and August saw an alarming number of

thefts from motor vehicles. In most cases, the thefts were opportunistic and minor, but the sense of violation was no less profound; especially on those where the perpetrator(s) entered garages. Although a suspect has reportedly been apprehended, it does not signify carte blanche to let down our guard. VBPD has a "Beep It to Keep It" program reminding people to lock their cars in the evening. Please remove any valuables from sight and please remove any firearms. Lastly, if you see a neighbor's garage door open after dark, please knock on their door and remind them.

Report, report, report: Routine VBPD patrols are allocated to Croatan in proportion to the threat and MPO Noha cannot be omnipresent. As with any organization trying to effectively allocate finite resources, the areas of greatest threat garner the lion's share of attention. Being relatively safe, Croatan does not attract much of that attention. But, if thefts occur, or if egregious violations of zoning regulations (loud parties, fights, drugs, etc.) occur in rental houses, by all means report it. While zoning violations should be called in to **3-1-1**, they have not proven effective, especially on weekends. Police non-emergency number is 757-385-5000. In an emergency, call 9-1-1. Also, please inform Mike Kelly or me of such occurrences. We'll catalog the events.
