Subsequently, we put on hold any further "meet and great" events and were unable to consider any Fall social event.


Through the efforts of Amanda Robinson, our Secretary and Social Committee Chair, and several other Board members (Katie Ripberger, Amber Torgerson, Bob Lougen), there were weekly food trucks from Spring through September. In August, for the many children in the neighborhood, we had the "Last Licks of Summer" (Free ice cream to the kids of Croatan) and, in October, we had a late afternoon "Halloween Scavenger Hunt" prior to children out collecting candy in the early evening. In November, was the Foodbank Fundraiser and virtual run/walk. That event raised \$2,311.

Cheryl Garvey, our Welcome Committee Chair gave away 28 baskets to new families moving into Croatan during the year.

John Mannarino, Beach Committee Chair, continued to monitor and engage the city public works restoration project engineers. If

you are reading his monthly notes in the newsletter, you know that the contract effort is with the US Army Corps of Engineers. The effort to get reasonable contractor bids is difficult. Hopefully, we will see significant progress before the Summer. At least, that's what he is being told.

"Connie" Agresti continued his campaign to advise the neighborhood on safety and security concerns. Besides the monthly newsletters, he has put out many notes on Nextdoor covering COVID-19 precautions and guidance; Hurricane Awareness, Preparation, and Precautions; Fire Safety; Beach/Water Safety; Hot weather precautions; Scammer alerts and tactics; Pet cleanup; Parking; Speeding in Croatan; and property crimes. He also submitted 17 Community Improvement reports to Public Works through the city See-Click-Fix application. He has also been a strong advocate for Croatan at the City's multi-agency Dogs-on-the-Beach program to preserve freedom of responsible dog ownership and freedom of dogs to run and exercise unleashed on sand beaches.

For those of you who haven't looked at the Croatan website, you should. We will be putting more information on it as we educate and address the issues. We encourage all members to pay your annual dues on the site and our most current neighborhood directory resides in the Member's Area. Bob Lougen, our Vice-President, created what you see and continues to make it better.

As we start 2021, our Treasurer, Jim Skarbeck, reports that we have \$39,644 in our general fund and \$2,410 in our security fund. I want to thank everyone for their membership and generosity this year. The extra contributions do help and are an important expression in your confidence with the Board of Directors.

The Board will continue to watch the COVID situation. We hope that we will soon be able to hold many of the social activities that we have had in the past. I am not sure we will be able to have a Spring Fling. If not, perhaps it will be a Summer or Fall Fling. As soon as we can, we want to get the neighborhood together again.

The next Board of Directors meeting will be virtual on Monday, February 1 at 6:30 PM. If you have an item you want placed on the agenda, please send it to me and plan on attending. I will provide the Zoom invite and connection to those members who wish to observe/participate.

# Safety, Security Update, Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), and Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO)

#### Bottom Line Up Front:

- New Driving Laws as of January 1, 2021

New Driving Laws effective January 1, 2021: Don't be the first on the block to run afoul of these laws.

- No Handhelds while Driving: Holding a device (e.g., cellphone) while driving on a highway in Virginia is now prohibited. Fines can go up to \$125 for the first offense and up to \$250 for second and subsequent offenses. It is time to put the phone down and focus on driving.
- Reckless Driving: Driving in excess of 20 miles per hour (MPH) above the posted speed limit on any road or 85 MPH on highways with a 75 MPH speed limit is now considered reckless driving.
- <u>Photo Speed Monitoring</u>: Cities and counties throughout Virginia may now monitor active construction and school zones with speed cameras. Tickets may be mailed for those driving more than 10 MPH above the posted speed limit.

**Speaking of speed:** By far the more frequent complaint I receive (and unneighborly practice I observe) is speeding – not just on Croatan Road but throughout our community (e.g., Vanderbilt, Va. Dare, Bushnell). Without sidewalks in many places, children play in streets while others stroll, bike, or exercise pets. Your car may have an automatic transmission, but you shouldn't; **please engage conscious brain mode** when car is "on" and drive kindly. Speed limit is 25 MPH throughout Croatan – slower when conditions (e.g., fog) dictate.



<u>Help for Depression</u>: The Holidays are not the "Hap-Happiest Time of the Year" if you have lost a loved one, are ill or caring for an ill family member, are impacted by the short days and chilly weather, have been beaten down by COVID-19 social distancing and travel restrictions, or suffer from one of the many forms of depression. <u>Disposal of Fireplace Ashes</u>: Fireplaces and fire pits are hot (no pun intended) commodities this winter, as people seek warmth in the fresh air absent indoor COVID-imposed reclusiveness. Improperly disposed-of ashes recently resulted in a fire that damaged 24 apartments and left scores of neighbors homeless. Fire officials caution to never assume that a fire is out until the ashes have been overhauled and are cool to the

touch. Ashes should be placed in a closable <u>metal</u> container for at least 24 hours after they are assumed to be out and that container should not be placed in a garage, on a deck, or near anything combustible. "Overhauling" means agitating the ashes with a metal garden rake or other such tool to ensure that there are no hidden pockets of heat, drenching any hot spots with water, and agitating again (...and again, if necessary).

<u>Please Pass the Jelly(fish)</u>: I spied an interesting jellyfish on our beach recently. This was a beefy specimen whose body was about 8" across and 5" high, with abundant purplish-brown "oral arms" (but no tentacles) reaching down from its center. Using the Virginia Institute of Marine Sciences' website - "Identify that Jellyfish" (Identify that Jellyfish | Virginia Institute of Marine Science (vims.edu)), I believe it was either a Cannonball Jelly or a Mushroom Cap Jelly. Both are uncommon (but not unheard-of) winter visitors to our shores and both have only a mild sting. I'm not sure how a dog's nose would react to it though, so I am providing this information with the advice to (apologies to *Polander*) "please pass [up] the jelly."

<u>Harbor Seal</u>: <u>The Virginia Pilot</u> reported on Sunday, January 3, that a harbor seal has been sighted ashore in Virginia Beach. The Virginia Aquarium warns not to approach closer to 150' and to call their Marine Mammal/Sea Turtle Stranding Hotline at 757-385-7575. (Why not add it to your phone?)

<u>Post-Thanksgiving Gunshots.</u> The good news is that CCL President Mike Kelly was able to obtain the copy of the police report (# 2020039317) submitted following the November 27 "shots fired" event at Twilight and S. Atlantic. The bad news is that the report is disappointingly scant of details. Some details were redacted while others are likely reserved for detective investigative files and not shared with the public lest they hamper the case(s) against the individual(s) charged. As always, I will pass on any public information as (if?) I learn it.

Both the Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) and the Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO) took December off of their meeting schedules. Next meetings will be January 13 and 14, respectively, at 7:00 PM. Both are expected to be virtual. I will ask about how citizens can get information on crimes impacting their neighborhoods more quickly.
