Beach Restoration by Mike Kelly

Just prior to Memorial Day, we had a series of storms that impacted the beach. The pictures below were taken on June 1st at high tide, a day after the storms ended. One picture shows a “hanging” stairway towards the south end of the beach where the dune has been eroded. The other is looking north from Twilight Lane where you see no damage. At our request, Public Works moved some sand to shore up bases of the exposed stairways.

We are entering into the accretion cycle so, hopefully, we will see some significant recovery over the next few months.



The US Army Corps of Engineers Rudee Inlet Maintenance Dredging Solicitation is supposed to be released on June 20th. It include the option that the city is funding which will take about 55,000 cubic yards of sand from the outer deposition area, east of the jetty, and put it on the Croatan Beach. I will keep you updated.

- Paper: office paper, newspaper, junk mail, magazines, phone books, paper bags
- Cardboard & Chipboard: flattened, un-waxed, clean & dry
- Plastics Bottles # 1 -7, NO plastic bags.
- Cartons, including food and beverage cartons (juice, milk, soy milk, soup, broth, etc.)
- Glass Bottles & Jars: clear, green & brown; remove & discard lids.
- Metals: aluminum, steel, or tin food & beverage cans; clean aluminum foil

Safety, Security Update, Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), and Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO)



Safety/Security:

Beach Safety - Diving: You may have seen the news: A 46-year-old man broke three vertebrae diving into the water at the Oceanfront – something he has done for years. He is now paralyzed. Sand bars shift on a daily basis. Be safe – don't dive into the water!

Hurricane Season: Officially began on June 1. While the month arrived without any named storms threatening Virginia Beach, a Memorial Day-weekend storm dropped our shoreline almost as dramatically as it dropped temperatures. Some Croatan beachgoers faced a $\pm 6'$ escarpment to get onto and off of the beach. Cross-over walkways previously anchored in sand were left suspended. It takes the City a few days (and many complaints) to get equipment out to level the "cliffs." Until they do, please be careful negotiating them. More importantly, be conscious of escape routes to egress the beach as the tide rises.

As borne out by our Memorial Day-weekend storm, surges and surf regularly over-wash Croatan Beach, so stay off during storms. Stock/ pack hurricane preparedness essentials. Please visit [Hurricanes | Ready.gov](#) for additional information, including learning your hurricane evacuation zone.

Plastic Kills: Both Nauticus (in downtown-Norfolk) and Norfolk Botanical Gardens have startling and distressing displays depicting the deleterious environmental and wildlife impacts of discarded plastic. Straws, toys, bottles, balloons, cans, bottle caps, candy, drink, tobacco, and/or snack wrappers, and ponytail holders are a daily eyesore and can choke, strangle, or block the digestion of sea mammals and shorebirds. Please be conscientious when cleaning up after your day at the beach.

Seasonal Dog Rules: Please remember that your dogs are allowed on Croatan Beach, leashed or loose, only between the daylight hours of 6:00 PM – 10:00 AM during "the season." Unleashed dogs must be under the verbal control of their handler. Please pick up after them.

Dogs are not allowed on the sand beach north of Rudee Inlet to 42nd Street at any time during the summer and only on the grassy part of the boardwalk, leashed at all times, for four hours per day (6 AM – 10 AM).

Minors and Alcohol: First of all – Congratulations to our residents and guests celebrating High School graduations. Well done in a tough year! That celebratory drink may seem appropriate, but must

regrettably wait. Adults serving alcohol to those under the age of 21 can be charged with a variety of misdemeanors for each child served. Don't shoot the messenger.

Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC):

Protests and Demonstrations: Groups exercising their First Amendment rights continue to demonstrate at the Oceanfront. On Saturday, June 19 ("Juneteenth"), a group known as "Underground 1865" has requested to conduct a demonstration.

Crime Statistics: The Second Precinct is showing positive numbers in almost all crime categories. The increased focus on interactive community policing has resulted in more than 50 illegal firearm confiscations just since the March 26 shootout. Speed Monitoring: Police are responding to citizen concerns about speeding on all roadways. We have seen speed control within our neighborhood and on General Booth Blvd. VBPD is working with Virginia State Police to monitor I-264 as well. Police cite many tickets being issued for speeds in excess of 80 and 90 MPH. Twenty MPH above the posted limit is reckless driving – big points, big fine, big insurance premium increase, big headache.

Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO) : There was no VBCCO meeting conducted in June, but there are a few things happening.

Short Term Rentals (STRs): The City Council is preparing to vote Tuesday, June 15 on whether to adopt STR Overlay districts and new STR restrictions. We have been told that the Council will accept public comment up until (but not the day of) their vote – so please write or call our Councilman Guy Tower and/or other Councilmembers with your concerns and vote.

Voting Districts: Courts have decided that Virginia Beach must revamp its process of voting for City Council and School Board members. Residents will be able to vote for representatives in their specific neighborhood (e.g., Beach) versus throughout the city. The City has sent out mailings (bright yellow postcards) discussing the options that the City Council will be voting on come June 15.

Flood Protections Program Survey: The Department of Public Works is seeking feedback on citizens' knowledge and opinions of the City's flood protection initiatives. This is very important to Croatan. Visit <https://publicinput.com/hub/3> to participate.


Juneteenth: The City will observe Juneteenth on Friday, June 18. Many City services will not be available that day, but some will. It pays to call ahead. **What is Juneteenth?** June 19 marks the day (in 1865) when Major General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, TX and declared the end of both the Civil War and slavery – nearly two years after President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation. There have been some interesting books written lately about the efforts of southern planters to move their slaves through Texas, to Mexico, and continue the antebellum way of life.

Bridge Update by Mike Kelly

As many of you know, Public Works removed the “home-built” bridge for safety reasons that had been there for many years. We are in the process of getting approvals for a replacement which we will build.

There are many details and requirements. For example, we had to submit the engineering profile above which shows that bottom of the joists are above the 100-year flood plain. But we are still waiting for the city to tell us the 100-year flood plain elevation for Lake Christine. We are using 8 feet for now but are hoping that it is a little lower. Why, you may ask? Because the bridge must be compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act. This will require a ramp from the path to the bridge surface on both sides. The lower elevation will make the ramp easier to build. We also discovered that, in addition to city approvals and permits, we must apply for a permit from the Virginia Marine Resources Commission and a US Corps of Engineers review is part of that process. I wouldn't be surprised if there are 20 people in the various agencies that must sign-off on our project. All of this takes time. Oh, did I mention that the city arborist must sign-off? Since it's city property, they must make sure that we are minimizing the impact on the trees. It is slow but moving along.
