

# President's Letter by Mike Kelly

Ladies and Gentlemen,

As I write this on Saturday morning, July 3<sup>rd</sup>, it's a beautiful day and will be a terrific 4<sup>th</sup> of July weekend. Hopefully, everyone has a plan to be happy. We are adjusting to the new normal. Many people will be visiting the beach this weekend and businesses are open. It will be a great summer in Virginia Beach.

The Virginia State of Emergency expired on June 30th. Of note, Virginia law again bans people from wearing face coverings in public despite most public places still requiring face masks. The Governor is expected to ask lawmakers to address the issue during a special session in August. Over the last week, Virginia has seen an average of 175 confirmed cases and 4 deaths per day. Virginia has the 35th most confirmed cases per capita among states during the same period. North Carolina is 28<sup>th</sup>. Reasonable actions are still important.

No progress on the beach restoration. Although expected in mid-June, the solicitation from the US Army Corps of Engineers is not out yet. I have not heard why there is a delay.

The Coastal / Fort Raleigh pedestrian bridge is very slowly going through the permitting process. I have no forecast on a start date.

Our next social event will be the End of Summer Party on Saturday, September  $18^{th}$  at the point. The time will be 3-7 PM. The format will be exactly like the Spring Fling. Cost will be \$20 for members (\$30 at the gate) and \$50 for non-members and guests (\$60 at the gate.)

# Safety, Security Update, Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC), and Virginia Beach Council of Civic Organizations (VBCCO)

#### Safety/Security - July 2021:

Beach Safety – Red Flags and Children: As we celebrate our independence, please remember that freedoms are only available for as long as we act responsibly. Storms, whether they hit us directly or brush past, can bring high surf, choppy and confused seas, and strong undertows or rip currents. When the lifeguards are flying RED flags, please be extra careful in and around the water. Unless they're part fish, children shouldn't not be in the water. If on a board, they should be tethered to the board. When children are in the water, a supervising adult should be alongside – not in a chair 15 – 20 feet up the beach or on a phone. If the child goes under, you will never find them. An hour or two of disappointment is better than a lifetime of heartache.

<u>Hurricane Elsa</u>: As I write this, Hurricane Else (or remnants thereof) is positioned to influence our weather during the mid-week following the Independence Day holiday. Please visit National Hurricane Center (noaa.gov) or Wakefield, VA (weather.gov) for current information.

New State Laws re: Bicyclists: Virginia State Law (Code § 46.2-869) requires drivers of motorized vehicles to give three feet of distance when passing bicyclists "at a reasonable speed." As of July 1, 2021, drivers are directed to change lanes, even if that means crossing the double yellow line (if safe to do so, i.e., no oncoming traffic) when overtaking a bicyclist by that 3' margin. The requirement for bicyclists to move from two-abreast to single file has been removed from the subsequent section. Opinion: Regardless, bicyclists bear the ultimate responsibility for their safety – ride with traffic and obey traffic signs and signals as if operating a motorized vehicle, use a light, wear a helmet (optional, for those age 15 and older). In a car/truck vs. bicyclist collision, being "in the right" won't keep bicyclists out of the hospital, or worse. Watch out for the other guy!

<u>Balloons</u>: As of July 1, 2021, the release of any lighter than air balloon is punishable by a fine of \$25 <u>per balloon</u>.



<u>Wipers on = Lights-on</u>: Virginia State law requires drivers to turn-on low beam headlights when operating windshield wipers. The low beams will illuminate your tail lights – <u>something that daytime running lights</u> <u>don't</u>. This allows drivers behind you to see your car through the rain, mist, and road spray. It is rarely dark enough for auto-sensing headlights to illuminate themselves. Accept that the fancy new car doesn't do everything, and switch on the lights.

#### **Seasonal Reminders:**

**Speed:** Speed limit in Croatan is 25 MPH – slower as conditions (e.g., pedestrians) warrant.

**Dogs**: Allowed on Croatan Beach, leashed or loose, between the daylight hours of 6:00 PM – 10:00 AM only, during "the season." Unleashed dogs must be under the verbal control of their handler. Handlers <u>must</u> pick up after them. (Yeah, that's a law, too).

**Parking:** Limited on-street parking is available on Surfside and Vanderbilt between 9:30 AM and 7:00 PM only. All parking for rental homes must be on the premises of that home. Special parking permits may be available on a limited basis through the city. Visit http://www.croatanbeach.org for instructions. Work vehicles may park along streets if they are in active use, but are not allowed to block the smooth flow of traffic.

**Adopt-a-Muster:** Croatan Civic League supported the Adopt-Muster program for police officers working the oceanfront on July 4.

<u>Crime Statistics</u>: The Second Precinct is showing positive numbers in all but two crime categories – robbery and motor vehicle theft.
