President's Letter by Mike Kelly

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Happy New Year to all.

As I write this, it is a cold, cloudy, damp day. While it is not raining or snowing, it isn't a day that most people are outside. It is January after all. We in Croatan and Virginia Beach are fortunate. So many disasters have occurred across the Nation and the World and we have had very few weather events that have caused significant problems over the last several decades. However, as we saw recently when people were stranded in their vehicles on I-95 in a snowstorm for more than 24 hours, it is important to be prepared. If you had been stuck, how would you have done? How would you do if the next Nor'easter knocks out power for several days? What other events would have major impact on your life and how are you prepared to handle them? My point is that at the beginning of 2022, it is good time to think about the things that could happen, good and bad, and what should you be doing to be ready?

The Board of Directors met on Monday, January 3rd via zoom. Despite Covid, last year was a pretty busy year. We are looking at a few more events in 2022. Besides an early Spring Membership Drive Social, you can plan on the Spring Fling at the Point on June 11th.

Our Treasurer, Jim Skarbek, reported that we ended 2021 with \$49,085.33 in the bank (as compared to 2020 with \$49,165.65. There are a few outstanding bills that will be paid in 2022, but overall, the finances are healthy. Security donations went up \$1,500.00.

Most of you have heard that Officer Don Noha retired from the VB Police. He supported Croatan for 24-years. He was presented with \$500 and a memento from the Civic League on December 29th. He is now in Huntsville, Alabama supporting the FBI, teaching explosives and disposal. I have his new address if any of you want to contact him.

We have hired Officer Katherine "Katie" Tassa as Don's replacement. When you see her in the neighborhood, be sure to stop and say hi.

There is no update on the Beach Nourishment Project. City Staff said it would begin in January.

The Coastal / Fort Raleigh pedestrian bridge encroachment request was approved unanimously by City Council on December 14th. Now it's time to start building. I will be sending a note out asking for your help. We need some good bridge builders, coffee, and, maybe, cookies.

The next Board of Director's meeting will be held on February 7th at 6:30 PM via Zoom. If you would like an invite, please let me know and I will send you one.

Farewell to Master Police Officer Don Noha

Don served Croatan's citizens faithfully for twenty-four years, during which many came to know and appreciate his efforts. When they speak of community policing, Don Noha was the example to emulate. His farewell note follows:

"Effective at the end of [2021], I will be retiring from the Virginia Beach Police Department with over 30 years of service. I began my law enforcement career with the City of Virginia Beach in 1991 as a Deputy with the Virginia Beach Sheriff's Office. I became a member of the VBPD in 1997. I have been assigned to the Bomb Squad as my primary duty as a Bomb Technician since August 2000. I have worked part-time in the Croatan neighborhood for the past 24 years.

"I am excited at the new opportunity retirement presents; I have accepted a position as an instructor for the FBI's Hazardous Devices School in Huntsville, Alabama. I will have the awesome responsibility of imparting the knowledge, skills and experience that I have gained in the past 21 years on the Bomb Squad to all new Public Safety Bomb Technician students from throughout the United States. It is an opportunity of a lifetime that few are chosen for. I am humbled at the mere thought of being something larger than myself that will benefit those new Bomb Techs nationwide."




