#### The beach will finally get some sand!

The long-awaited dredging of Rudee Inlet has begun. This picture of the dredge at the easter end was taken on Thursday, April 7<sup>th</sup>.



You may recall from previous updates that the contract for the dredging includes sand placed on the Croatan beach. The initial dredging will send sand to the resort beach. In about 10 days, a large pipeline will be placed on Croatan beach and the dredge will pump sand to the south. That should take a week. The amount is supposed to be about 55,000 cubic yards. The normal accretion cycle begins around this time of the year so this should help a lot.

We have two great events this month. I hope to see many of you at the **Members Social** on Friday, April 29th at Beachside Social off 27<sup>th</sup> St. Details are on the CCL website. It's free, but you need to RSVP.

The second event is the following day – the Croatan Cares 5K Walk/Run. Details are also on the website. Even if you don't participate, please consider donating. It is a charity event for the Foodbank of Southeastern Virginia and the Eastern Shore. Spread some of your good fortune around!

Area Code Usage: Beginning April 9, Verizon reports that you will have to dial area code 757 when calling locally; think: police non-emergency number 757-385-5000 and any other local service numbers. Be sure to change your auto-dial systems to reflect this change.

<u>Personal Safety</u>: MPO Katie Tassa reports that that she <u>finds at least one garage door open in the neighborhood every third patrol</u>. This is during the wee morning hours. She also reports bicycles left in driveways/yards overnight. These are prime targets for thieves cruising the 'hood not to mention offering easy violation of one's home and nocturnal bliss. I've found my garage door open some mornings too, so be sure to check twice.

<u>Motor Vehicle Thefts</u>: Motor vehicle thefts continue to soar – up 130 percent city-wide in the last month-over-month comparison (<u>up 120 percent in the Second Precinct</u>). I cannot say it enough – do not leave vehicles unlocked or idling for a quick dash for coffee, forgotten item, etc.; even in your own driveway. Do not leave fobs or valuables (especially firearms) in vehicles. Keep even small change out of sight. Motor vehicle thefts are crimes of opportunity and there are lots of opportunists out there.

<u>Croatan Parking Lot</u>: No April Fools joke – as of April 1 it costs to park in the Croatan Beach parking lot (south end of Vanderbilt Ave) <u>if you arrive after 10:00 AM</u>. <u>Cost for Virginia Beach residents is \$3/day</u>. All others pay \$7. Credit cards are the preferred method of payment. There are no re-entry passes or privileges, so if you leave and return, you'll have to pay again. Also, no break for Croatan residents. On the plus side, the lot is now open until 8:00 PM. These changes will remain in effect until lot closing on September 30. (You can still park for free from 6:00 – 10:00 AM)

Motorcycle Safety: Last month I wrote of bicycle safety. This month, I address their big brothers – the HOGS. As bikers clean the winter cobwebs from their spokes and carbon from their pipes, be especially careful for them taking to the roads in increased numbers. Most bikers ride sober and responsibly, wear helmets, burn headlights, and take preemptive actions to avoid dangerous situations. While some don't, regardless of how responsibly they ride, all lack protection in the event of a collision. A collision between a motorcycle and another vehicle will result serious injury or death. Please be on the lookout – both visually and audibly. Loud pipes may be an irritant to some but they save lives on the highway. Motorcycles are entitled to a full traffic lane - don't crowd them, follow them too closely, or cut them off. Be especially careful when turning left. Motorcyclists can easily lose control on wet pavement, milled pavement, leaves, or grass clippings. Don't leave the latter two in the roadway.

<u>Sun's Out, "Gun's" Out</u>: April is when we start to shed the heavier wraps in favor of cut-offs and sandals in search of some natural Vitamin D. <u>Remember to use sunscreen</u>. It's been a long, cold winter and many of us are paler than we were in October. Start slowly. The same goes for weeding, cutting the lawn, or planting. Whether we hit the gym or think it's a mis-spelled man's name, we're restarting a new exercise regimen. We're all a year older, so take it slow, rest often, and work up to your summer endurance levels. And drink plenty of water.

<u>Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC)</u>: The March 9 CAC meeting and a subsequent "Coffee with the Captain" (of the Second Precinct) (on March 24), Second Precinct Commander, Capt. Harry McBrien, gave us the opportunity to review many of the changes made at the Oceanfront over the last year as part of efforts to improve safety of residents and visitors. Additional lighting has been emplaced and police foot and bicycle patrols are increasing. Overgrowth has been removed from the vicinity of the 19<sup>th</sup> Street parking lot – scene of a fatal shooting last March – and a number of firearms were recovered from having been "stashed" in those bushes. Overall, confiscations of illegal firearms are nearing 200 – many of them high-powered weapons with high-capacity magazines. Shot-spotter technology has also been deployed at the Oceanfront and in other high-crime areas of the city and has led to a number of arrests.

Crime deterrent strategies include cleaning-up and rehabilitating run-down dwellings and apartment complexes, deployment of crisis intervention teams (to assist those in mental health or substance abuse crises), providing underprivileged children with recreation center memberships, and community outreach efforts that place police in neighborhoods along with ice cream trucks, hot dog vendors, etc.


