I want to emphasize that the move to "Phase IV Physical Measures" is a result of a petition signed by the residents who live on property adjacent to Croatan Rd. I have heard that some people, who do not live on Croatan Rd., are not in favor of stronger measures for speed reduction. I urge you to come to the presentation to hear the what, why, and when. Also, if you don't routinely do so, I would urge you to walk Croatan Rd. Perhaps you don't exceed 25 MPH, but quite a few others do. If you are walking, running, walking a dog, or riding a bike, it can be pretty uncomfortable.

Beach Update for August 2022

Here is the latest on Croatan Beach repair and nourishment.

As most of you know, the storm that occurred after Memorial Day did considerable damage to the berm and dune structure south of Croatan Rd. The north side was okay because the city has just put down approximately 50,000 cubic yards of sand taken from the outer deposition area of Rudee Inlet.



The Department of Public Works (DPW) met with Bob Lougen, ADM Chuck Kubic and me on June 16th. Rosemary Wilson and Guy Tower also attended the meeting. I previously reported DPW's intent to find the sand to put on the southern part of the beach.

I had an update phone call with the DPW Director, L J Hansen, on August 1. He told me that he met with his staff, and they have identified the scope of the work. Currently, it is approximately 130,000 cu. yd. of sand. The challenge, as always, is how to get the funding. He said that he has talked with the City Manager and that they are trying to identify a "funding stream." My guess is that it will cost several million dollars. The city does not have that level of funding laying around and they are working on it. He hopes to do the work late this year. They have asked the Corps of Engineers and the State for help. No luck.

I will get an update from DPW in two weeks and will report to you.

Traffic Calming

Despite a combination of many past efforts to control speeding, including use of police enforcement, a \$200.00 fine posted at the entrance, and other lesser speed calming devices like poles and a portable cityowned sign that monitors one's speed, speeding remains a very serious problem particularly observable on the main ingress and egress on Croatan Road. The problem is so pervasive that our neighborhood is now classified as being in Phase IV of the City's neighborhood traffic study. This allows further assistance from the City of VA Beach in an effort to bring speeding under control.

The Department of Public Works has offered to speak to us about the next phase of speed calming devices: how they work, where they may likely be placed, when to expect with their installation, and for how long they will remain in place.

Please join us at the VB Rescue Squad building on Tuesday, Aug 23rd from 6-8 p.m. to learn more and be able to get answers directly from the experts.

<u>Please share with renters</u>: Welcome to our community. We hope you enjoy visiting Croatan as much as we enjoy living here. Please respect our beach and community. Here are some recommendations and guidelines (from local ordinances) to help make this a stress-free summer.

Dog Days of Summer: Simple reminders on these hot days:

- Try not to walk dogs in the hottest part of the day.
- Keep plenty of water available for you and your pet.
- Dogs must be off beach between 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM daily.
- Dog waste must be picked up and properly disposed of in abundant garbage bins.

Beach Reminders:

- Don't swim alone
- Wear sunscreen
- No diving
- Fill in holes
- Please pick-up your trash

Parking Reminders:

Rental parking must be on property of the rental

- Do not park in such a way as to block mailboxes, driveways, or fire hydrants
- Surfside and Vanderbilt marked parking spots are available from 9:30 AM until 7:00 PM only (visitors and residents, alike)
- Parking lot at south end of Vanderbilt opens at 6:00 AM and closes at 8:00 PM. You may park for free before 10:00 AM.

General Safety:

- Be sure to lock cars and remove valuables (especially firearms).
- Do not leave unattended cars idling motor vehicle theft is a crime of opportunity.
- Prune vegetation to prevent obscuring driver sight distance and expose signage
- Speed limit is 25 MPH throughout Croatan, slower if necessary
- Bicyclists under 15 must wear helmets.

<u>Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC)</u>: No CAC meeting held in July, but there was a Citizens Advisory Board (CAB) meeting held August 1. Police Chief Paul Neudigate asked that citizens <u>not engage suspected car</u> <u>thieves physically</u>. Video shows that some of these perpetrators arm openly armed. Chief Neudigate does not want to risk citizen injury by engaging in a firefight with these ne'er-do-wells. Rather, call 9-1-1.
