
I have no updates from the city on the beach.

## Safety/Security - September 2022

<u>Back to School:</u> September is the appropriate time to remind us to be extra vigilant when driving. Please put the cell phones down and focus on children walking to/from school and bus stops — especially as the duration of daylight shortens. Some timely reminders -

**School Zones:** Reduce your speed for the full length of school zones.

<u>School Buses</u>: Flashing red lights mean <u>STOP</u>, even if approaching from the opposite direction (unless separated by a highway median). <u>Be alert – there is no median on General Booth Blvd between Croatan Road and Rudee bridge</u> – therefore you must stop for red flashing school buses on the opposite side of the road.

**Garbage School:** A recent sojourn down S. Atlantic one Tuesday (garbage collection day) morning revealed so many open and overflowing garbage and recycling bins that I had to question whether I was in a Bronx tenement alleyway rather than a throughfare of million-dollar homes. <u>It really looked bad!</u> Some "garbage school" tips:

- Crush boxes and plastic water bottles dead air is bad on the radio and in garbage cans
- Obtain Extra Bins if necessary, from VB Waste Management at 757-385-4650 pr wastemgt@vbgpv.com. Lids are required to close.
- Bulky Item Collection must be pre-arranged with Waste Management by previous Friday (same contact info as above)
- Recycling blue containers <u>do not place plastic bags into recycling</u>. Small loose items and paper should be in paper bags. (See graphic for allowable items)
- Yard Waste do not exceed 25 pounds per bag. Cut limbs to four feet in length.
- Bins go curbside Monday afternoon and should be brought in Tuesday evening.
- Visit <u>Curbside Services</u> :: <u>VBgov.com</u> <u>City of Virginia Beach</u> for all the rules and regulations



<u>Critter Deterrence</u>: "Garbage School" is not just for aesthetics. Croatan is home to many wild animals. Some (e.g., birds, turtles, rabbits) add to the color of the area, while others (e.g., snakes, rats) do not. Since the primary predator (red and gray foxes) were removed, the unwanted animals have proliferated. <u>Overflowing garbage cans attract them</u> and even "cute" animals like squirrels and raccoons can be especially destructive (so can many birds (e.g., crows). The lids of trash bins are required to close to deter these pests and help keep our neighborhood an attractive and safe place to live.

<u>Dogs on the Beach</u>: As of sunrise, Tuesday, September 6 dogs are allowed on Croatan Public Beach during all daylight hours. They can be leashed or unleashed, but if running free, must be responsive to the handler's voice commands. The sand can still get hot, so be mindful of bringing dogs during the height of the day. Hot sand (often > 120°) can damage their paw pads. If the sand feels too hot for you to walk barefoot, it is probably too hot for the pup as well. As always, please pick up after your dog – it's the law. All beach entrances are well provisioned with plastic bags and trash cans.

<u>Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC)</u>: Second Precinct Commander, Captain Harry McBrien, detailed the Crime Suppression Squad's success in capturing <u>some</u> suspected car thieves and taking additional illegal weapons off of the street. He noted that 50 - 60% of stolen vehicles are being found with the key fobs in the vehicles. Be smart – lock your vehicles and remove valuables - especially firearms.
