Flex Posts: Reflective flex posts have been replaced along the Croatan Road walking/biking path. Please protect these devices that provide a safe separation barrier on this heavily traveled street where sidewalks are absent. The posts represent your tax dollars at work.

QR Codes: Organizations and social media are warning of numerous scams involving QR (Quick Response) codes – those ubiquitous checkerboard-resembling boxes that take one to websites, restaurant menus, etc. Clicking on them with a smartphone "QRC Reader" application can take you to a variety of places – not all of which are legitimate. **Do not assume that the links are kosher, read the link carefully, and do not sign-up for or subscribe to anything**. I was spoofed to a look-alike site recently while trying to access information on medicine I received from a military pharmacy. Search "QRC Scams" online to make you and your family aware.

23andMe: The Wall Street Journal reports that DNA search company 23andMe has filed for bankruptcy and intends to sell all its assets, including personal and genetic data for its more than 15 million subscribers. Those who have used 23andMe are encouraged to request that the company delete their information from its database.

Balloon Release is Illegal: As graduation and wedding seasons approach, we can expect an increase in celebrations on the beach. A recent posting to Nextdoor reported observing the release of "more than 30" celebratory balloons. The Commonwealth of Virginia made this practice illegal and imposed a **\$25 fine per balloon**, because non-biodegradable (e.g., mylar) balloons <u>will</u> come down at sea and may be ingested by or entangle marine and avian fauna.

Motorcycle Awareness: Please **look twice** for motorcyclists, especially when changing lanes and making turns. Give riders extra following distance, especially in the rain. Bikers – <u>including e-bicyclists</u> – please burn a headlight and ride defensively/responsibility.

<u>Croatan Parking Lot</u>: Parking fees began April 1 for those entering the Croatan parking lot after 10:00 AM. Virginia Beach residents are charged \$3.00, while non-residents are charged \$7.00. Pay at kiosks or by on-line apps. Lot closing time moved to 8:00 PM. And will remain so through October.

On-Street Parking: A limited number of on-street parking spaces are available on Surfside and Vanderbilt, north of Croatan Road. These spaces are time limited – 9:30 AM – 7:00 PM. Please do not block driveways or mailboxes. Non-time-limited parking is available on other neighborhood streets, mostly west of Virginia Dare.

CCL has filed a FOIA request for a copy of the parking enforcement contract the city has in place. With that information, we hope that former government contracting officers we have in the neighborhood can draft a practical contract line-item option for the city to use to add Surfside and Vanderbilt parking enforcement into the contractor's statement of work.

VBCCO MEETING HELD WEDNESDAY, MARCH 19, 2025


- Jason from the Virginia Beach Real Time Crime Center was the guest speaker.
