
SHORT-TERM RENTALS IN CROATAN

Recently, there have been some questions and concerns about Short-Term Rentals (STRs) in the Croatan Neighborhood.

- An STR is an entire dwelling rented for less than 30 consecutive days for compensation.
- There are only two areas where new STRs can be permitted, the Oceanfront Resort STR Overlay District (map attached) and the Sandbridge Special Service District.
- There are STRs in Croatan that were approved and permitted prior to the establishment of these two districts which was Sept. 7, 2021.
- Every STR property located within the City of Virginia Beach, regardless of location, is required to post an identification sign in accordance with Section 241.2(4) of the City Zoning Ordinance. If a property is being used as an STR it must have proper sign posted, as well as comply with other provisions of the STR zoning instructions.

School's Open: Please give yourself and our neighborhood children your *focused* attention when driving, whether to those walking to/from bus stops or when you're driving your child to school. No cell phone, no "to do" list, no mental math on work arrival time, etc.


On streets and highways without a median, drivers must stop for school buses displaying flashing red lights. *General Booth Blvd north of Croatan Road is undivided – you must stop even if traveling in the opposite direction of a stopped school bus*. Consider using your car's own flashers when doing so.

Virginia Beach now has permission to use traffic cameras to ticket speeders in school zones. You've been alerted.

<u>Lifeguards Are Gone – Rip Currents Remain</u>: Croatan Beach loses its lifeguards after Labor Day. If you're going into the water, please do so with a buddy – or let someone know where you are.

As seen with Hurricane Erin this past month – storms hundreds of miles to sea can cause punishing surf and lifethreatening rip currents. While advised not to enter the water in these conditions, people do. City lifeguards rescued more than 150 bathers from rip currents one weekend alone. Know how to escape rip currents. Also subscribing to *VBAlert* will keep you informed of current beach hazards. Visit VBAlert | City of Virginia Beach.

The Atlantic Hurricane Season still has two months to go. Erin grew from a Tropical Storm to a Category 5 hurricane with winds of 140 MPH in a matter of hours and the Atlantic seaboard was fortunate that she stayed out to sea. Favorite National Hurricane Center for the latest information and forecast. That site is updated repeatedly throughout the day.



E-Bikes: Please operate e-bikes maturely, as in: obey traffic laws, signs, and signals, don't travel at more than the posted speed limit, wear a helmet, do not ride on boardwalk, approach pedestrians and animals with care.

Because they are small, often black, fast, and quiet, e-bikes seemingly appear out of nowhere often surprising automobile operators, pedestrians, and animals – all of which can lead to accidents. Many e-bikes lack lights (a requirement for nighttime operation but, as with motorcycles, a recommended way to be seen during daylight as well).

Citizen complaints of irresponsible and reckless operation have led the City to form an interagency task force to review operation of these conveyances. CCL has also received reports of ebike operators tearing up yards in our neighborhood and disturbing individuals' peace and quiet on our beach. Among the few ordinances that do exist regarding e-bike operations is a prohibition against riding them on dunes and beaches. Also, sand and salt don't do ball bearings or electrical parts any favors. Enjoy your ride, smartly.

Dogs on the Beach: As of 6:00 PM, Monday, September 1 (Labor Day), dogs are again allowed on Croatan Beach during all daylight hours. They may be unleashed if under the handler's verbal command. It should go without saying, but regrettably it doesn't, to please clean up after your pup.

<u>Croatan Parking Lot</u>: Parking fees begin their seasonal hiatus at the Croatan parking lot (902 Vanderbilt Avenue), effective Wednesday, October 1. This annual change will be accompanied by the parking lot closing time being dialed back to 5:30 PM.

CITIZEN'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CAC):

The August Second Precinct CAC meeting was held in concert with City Councilman Worth Remick's District 6 Community Meeting on August 13. Topics of discussion included fraud awareness, emergency preparedness (<u>Emergency Preparedness | City of Virginia Beach</u>), and long-range planning for development around the "Central Beach District," which Councilman Remick described as the area around the Convention Center (Birdneck Rd to Cypress and I-264 to 17th Street).

The CAC meets every second Wednesday of the month at 7:00 PM in the conference room of Virginia Beach Volunteer Rescue Squad #14, 740 VB Blvd (17th Street). CAC meetings are open to all. Next meeting is September 10. Please park on the east side of the building.

I intend to ask City representatives to improve the timeliness of push notifications of events (like the August 31 ten-miler footrace) that close or restrict neighborhood ingress/egress to main thoroughfares, like Gen. Booth Blvd.

Let's keep moving—for our bones, our hearts, and our community.


