<u>Lithium-Ion Battery Disposal:</u> I read a warning recently regarding disposal of lithium-ion batteries. Please do not put these in trash as they have been known to start fires. Most hardware stores (e.g., Home Depot) have bins in the store for proper disposal. If unsure, treat any rechargeable battery as lithium-ion.

<u>Littering:</u> Readers of this document are conscientious stewards of our neighborhood, streets, and beaches. However, in recent weeks, several ridiculously egregious examples of littering have been brought to my attention. These include abandoning dirty diapers (really?) and empty beer

bottles/cases on our streets and (depicted here) White Claw partiers discarding what appears to be a full case of empties on the beach. As the saying goes - "Come on, man!" While we normally discover the trash after the litterbugs have fled, our Second Precinct Community Liaison Officer, Kishon M. Roberts, informs me that anyone witnessing littering, should report it to police at their non-emergency number (757-385-5000). Officer Roberts may be reached at rmroberts@vbgov.com or 757-817-9825. Please get descriptives of those involved, license plates, car type/color, etc. Partying can be cool, but littering is not cool – just






remember the lyrics to *Alice's Restaurant* – "What are you in for? Littering. And they all moved away."

Protection of Primary Sand Dunes: We had two nasty nor'easters hit our shores in October. These storms generated significant waves, storm surges, and wind. Protection of our property rests in the ability of our primary sand dunes to absorb the brutal punishment that nature doles out. I walked Croatan Beach on Saturday, (11/1) and could easily see where the surf washed up into the primary dune. A number of snow (dune) fences, especially at the southern end of our beach, were damaged, buried, or missing. This is a reminder that dune fencing needs to be emplaced at an angle to the surf line. Placing fencing in this manner will help the dune regenerate and strengthen the protective barrier that the dunes provide. <u>Porch Pirates</u>: As seasonal online shopping picks up, ne'er-do-wells conduct their own shopping by cruising neighborhoods (especially, up-scale ones – like Croatan) in search of freebees. The CCL has asked for increased security patrols during November and December, but we can collectively protect ourselves with some common sense practices, such as:

- Always ask the online vendor to overwrap the product so that the actual content (e.g., new Windows 11 computer) is not visible.
- Schedule deliveries for periods when someone is expected to be home (e.g., weekends).
- If you have security cameras, be sure that they're charged and operational.
- Arrange for a non-working (e.g., retired) neighbor to receive packages or keep a lookout for deliveries.
- Arrange delivery directly to a gift recipient or to a neutral location (e.g., Mail Boxes, Inc).

- Monitor email for delivery notifications. I have found that this is often my first indication of a delivery even when I am at home.
- Finally, keep a look-out for suspicious vehicles and persons. **Caveat**: it has become common to conduct deliveries by non-liveried individuals in private autos. Just verify that they're carrying packages <u>TO</u> the residence versus <u>AWAY</u> before calling authorities. Police non-emergency number is 757-385-5000.

CITIZEN'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE (CAC)

CAC meets at 7:00 PM on the second Wednesday of each month. Meetings are open to all. Please park on the east side of the building. The next meeting is November 12 at Virginia Beach Volunteer Rescue Squad #14 conference room (740 VB Blvd – aka: 17th Street).

Officer Recognition: At the November 12 meeting, CAC will recognize two detectives whose work helped lead to the arrest of EBK (Everybody Killer) gang members and confiscation of weapons, drugs, etc.

Drone Operations: VBPD drone operators will also provide a briefing.

<u>17th Street Improvement Project</u>: This multi-year project has begun. The City assures us that businesses will remain open during construction, but navigation may be difficult on a road that may be limited to one lane in each direction for the next few years. The website <u>17th Street/Virginia Beach Boulevard...</u> | <u>City of Virginia Beach should have the current information</u>. Alternatively, use the *Waze* smartphone app to identify detours.

<u>Citizen's Advisory Board</u>: with the VBPD Chief Paul Neudigate, the Deputy Chiefs, and Precinct Commanders was held on November3. Police are gearing up for the Holiday shopping season with a walk-through of Lynnhaven Mall. Personal security advice includes:

- Keep at least one hand unencumbered at all times.
- Shop with a friend or partner.
- Keep any packages out of sight.
- Lock your car as soon as you get into it.
- Do not unlock your care from a distance, especially if lights and horn sound when you unlock.
- Keep your head on a swivel and be aware of your surroundings.
- If you feel uncomfortable, return to the mall and request a security escort.
- Stay off the phone while walking to your car.
